

REWARDS

We encourage students to take responsibility for their progress and achievements. We collect data on each individual's progress and set targets which are regularly reviewed. We closely monitor progress and we put in place strategies to help students meet targets and improve their performance.

There are many ways a student is rewarded for academic achievement, having a positive attitude to learning and Citizenship.

CONSEQUENCES

We will always try to treat our students fairly. In applying the Behaviour for Learning Policy we will take into consideration the nature of the incident, the individual involved and the Code of Conduct.

These are the consequences that will be applied if a student's behaviour is adversely affecting their own or others' learning:

C1	First misbehaviour – Verbal warning Name goes on the board
C2	Second misbehaviour – Verbal warning Name goes on the board
C3	Third misbehaviour – Final warning Name goes on the board Discuss with member of staff outside of lesson time – 30 minute detention at lunch time or after school
C4	Fourth misbehaviour – Removal to another classroom. 1 hour department detention
C5	Fifth misbehaviour – Removal to the Behaviour Support Room in isolation for the rest of the lesson. Isolation all the following day and detention that night
C6	Sixth misbehaviour – Headteacher involvement Exclusion for a fixed period

Students may also be required to carry out a Community Service e.g. litter picking as a response to their actions or behaviour

School sanctions may be applied for an incident which occurs outside school and affects a member or members of the school community.
